Futurity

I was reading a survey in Vanity Fair. What caught my eye and imagination was the question "In the obituary of your dreams, which one of the following phrases would you most like to see? a) survived by eight grandchildren, b) at the age of 99, c) well-known philanthropist, d) flags will be flown at half-mast, e) after a brief illness." At an astounding three to one ratio, everyone surveyed, both parents and non-parents all agreed that *a*) survived by eight grandchildren was the one phrase they all aspired to.

I thought back to my mom, who never hesitated to tell me, "You think you love your children? Just wait until you have grandchildren!" When Peter left this world, I grieved not only for the loss of him, but for the loss of my never-to-be grandchildren. To this day it is still an open wound.

We live our lives like immortals. When we are very young, the concept of dying is not one we can apply to ourselves or those we love. As we live and experience loss, it becomes a concept that we try to understand but it still doesn't apply to us. Then, we have children and futurity becomes something we begin to recognize. Finally, we see in them the beginning of ourselves and all our efforts go into teaching them our values so that they will grow into adults like us. As we age, it becomes a comfort to know that though we may not be physically here, we will continue in a future world we will never know but our children – and more important – our grandchildren, will inhabit along with the memory of us and hopefully, all the life lessons and family sagas we have instilled and implanted in them.

I wonder sometimes why futurity seems so important. Even after losing our children and learning the survival skills it takes to live each day to the fullest, aside from

Nine and a half years ago, when the world stopped turning for me, I listened, without hearing, to the platitudes offered by those observing my sorry state. When I railed against the heavens, when I begged for release from the pain, when I prayed that I could join my beloved, now dead, child, all anyone could do was stand by and watch. There really was nothing anyone dared say without getting some horrific retort from me. So those who stayed just listened. Most drifted away, unable or unwilling to cope with the despair that emanated from my every pore.

The days were as dark as the nights. Nothing and no one could offer me any hope. And in looking back, it is hope that we all long for. It's taken years and years to heal to this point, and as the painful season of "joy" approaches, I thought I would reflect a little bit, on the journey, the distance and the light that slowly appears at the end of the tunnel. Sure they're all cliches. But as those of us who have lived for years in the world of metaphor know only too well, they are cliches because they describe this place so well.

This will be our tenth Thanksgiving without Peter. That first Thanksgiving I thought it would be a good idea to surround (con't on page 2)

missing our children, we all miss the children they didn't get a chance to have. Is it a conceit to think that our values will matter in the world if they are carried forward by our progeny? Do we always harbor a wish that one of our heirs will make a difference in the world – therefore making us matter?

I am at a difficult stage once more. All my friends are becoming grandparents. They delight in these mini versions of themselves as I'm sure I would too. But I'm not sure they even know why they are so delighted by these children. But I know that if I did have grandchildren, I'm sure, like all my friends, I too would be oblivious to what now eats at my soul. I would simply delight in their existence. I would marvel at their growth. I would be so proud of their accomplishments. I would take such comfort in their unconscious mission – to carry my history and that of my family into their future. But the loss of them -the impossibility of their existence and my being condemned to another kind of "neverness", is every bit as painful and ongoing as the loss of Peter.

Those of us with surviving children continue to hope. And though many may not have the pleasure of grandchildren, they at least have the distraction of a continuing family while hope lives deep inside. As the holiday season creeps upon us once more, I am brought back again to all I am missing. I put these thoughts aside again and prepare to share in the delight of my friends.

Knowing I am part of such a compassionate and understanding community as TCF is what really helps me get through the impending season of joy. Though I wish Peter was here for me to brag about, I will content myself with the knowledge that you, my friends, really know how palpable an absence each of our losses creates, especially this time of year. Thank you for being such an important part of my life.

SEASONS

The change of seasons is difficult. It reminds me that I must change if I am to live again.

We can become stuck in our grief, full of self-pity and overwhelmed with pain. I do not believe our children would want us to live the rest of our lives in pain and misery. It is so easy to fall into the "black pit" and never have the strength or courage to crawl out – because crawl out we must... on our bellies.

We are different now, with different priorities and goals. We must find a new purpose for going on, and we must accept the changes in our lives – including ourselves, for we are different now.

We cannot go backward, though there are times we yearn to. We must go forward. If we don't, we stay stuck at the point that our world changed. I used to say "ended".

Change is difficult. To accept the loss of our child is the most difficult of all. Our comfort comes from believing that the love we share will go on for all of eternity and that we will be united again – and each day brings us closer. We must learn to live again, love again, feel joy and peace again – or our survival will be without value to ourselves or to others.

myself with the activity of the day and make dinner for my remaining family. It was a major mistake. The day proved more difficult than I imagined and for years after, Phil and I refused the company of friends or family and remained sequestered at home with the tiniest turkey we could find. It was several years later, with two other couples, also newly childless, that I attempted Thanksgiving dinner again. And with my new friends we all reflected on how grateful we were to have had our kids, even while we continued to rail together at the fates for our mutual misfortune.

The December holidays, hot on the heels of Thanksgiving, brought only more pain. Store windows, newspaper ads, magazines, television, radio... the holidays were in my face everywhere I turned. There really wasn't anywhere to hide. It was a painful annual rite of passage. But to where?

No getting around it. In spite of us, the world keeps turning. The holidays come relentlessly every year. Along with all the other special days we must anticipate and endure. But for me, more than nine holiday seasons later, the edge has finally softened. Thanksgiving remains difficult, but not as difficult. We can even enjoy sharing the day with friends. And the beauty of the holiday season, especially in a city like ours, no longer makes me angry. I'm glad now, to know that so many people are untouched (yet) by tragedy. That they can enjoy the holiday season with the brightness and clarity of innocence. And I suspect now, that so many others are like me. I no longer feel so uniquely tragic.

I am an observer now, not exactly a participant. But from my perspective, high on a perch looking back over so much of life, I can appreciate the wonder, and remember that I too was innocent once, untouched by tragedy. And knowing what I now know about life, I look at all the joy and know how tenuous it all is. I've also learned the human spirit is a miraculous thing. And that as the world turns, as night turns into day, despair can turn to hope. As the pain begins to subside, the restorative power of hope returns.

For those who are only recently bereaved it is important to understand that there is no timetable for healing from our wounds. No formula. For some it is months, some years, some decades. Taking it one hour then one day at a time is key. There is no way to rush the process. But finding hope... that the pain will begin to soften, that despair will lift, that life will once again be worth living, that the thought of our children will bring a smile instead of tears, that just maybe, we will be with our children again someday...you can be sure the power of hope will return.

The world is still turning. We're just going along for the ride. Rest assured we all reach the same destination. No need to ask if we're almost there yet. One day, without even realizing, we'll know because our kids will be there, waiting.
