Note\* I wrote this in 2015 so I've done a bit of editing regarding Peter's age and the time he's been gone. That's all that's changed. He's still the best thing that ever happened to me and I remain forever grateful for having had him. Marie

Strange thing, time markers.. July 14<sup>th</sup> was/is Peter's birthday. If he had stayed with us he'd be 52. Instead, he's forever an indelible 22. He's been gone now 30 years! We've been without him for as long as we had him. Interesting that he is so present in my life. I feel like I had him longer than I've suffered without him present.

Less than a year after Peter died, a little grey kitten fell into our lives. He was born under a truck...and a lucky star. After a wonderful 21-year run, my Boomer joined Peter, Max Daisy, Sammy, Max Ginger, Middle and Fluffy a day before Peter's birthday in 2015.

Having lost Peter, my child, I was a bit confounded at how sad I felt about this loss. After all, he was just a cat. But I've learned that losing my child was about losing the love – or thinking in the beginning, that all love was lost. The worst had happened. My grief was so all consuming I never imagined I could ever feel bad about any other loss. So it started me reflecting once again on how dark and hopeless everything was 30 years ago and how far I've traveled on this tear stained path. Far enough to grieve the loss of my cat. Except that this grief, I knew, would pass.

trust the descriptions in the books ... maybe those written by a bereaved parent. Only those of us who have been there know how it feels and since there is no language adequate to describe what this catastrophe feels like, we speak in metaphor to civilians and find the most solace in the company of others who travel with us. No explanations necessary. We just know.

On becoming a parent: "everything we did was a first – first bath, first walk, first drive in the car, it was like we walked into an alternate universe that looked just like the old one, but all the rules were different and we had to relearn how to live."

In our alternate universe we have a slew of firsts; all painful and designed as markers leading to what we naively think will be the end of mourning. The first week, the first month, first birthday, Valentines Day, Spring, Mother's Day, Father's Day, Summer, Fall, Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Years ... Anniversary.

That dreaded first anniversary when each day in the final week brings us back to thinking "last year it was his last Monday, Tuesday...Thursday...Saturday...", anticipation of that

commemorative first anniversary taking our breath away. Once again, all the rules are different, and we have to relearn how to live.

I am the mother of just one child – and he is no longer present. The memory of him is as vivid as if he was here yesterday. I see his image in my mind's eye and I hear his booming voice and contagious laugh. I am so sorry he had only 22 years with us, but I am even sorrier for me, for all I've lost as a result of his leaving. And yet – my life is richer for having had him and having the memory of who he was. If I had never had a child, I would never have known the intensity of love that Peter brought to my life. That ignorance would not have been bliss, for it would have denied my understanding and empathy for so much of life's connections.

This year, at the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his passing, I know Peter was and still is the best thing that ever happened to me. Despite the pain and sorrow of his passing, Peter continues to bring value to my life, and for that, I am so grateful.

### **ON TIME**

Wordless and wordless Endless and forever grief goes on It takes the best And leaves the rest an empty shell Life is hell

David was dead four months when I wrote that in my journal. Time was the enemy. As I envisioned the future of my life I saw only a vast expanse of desert – dry, parched and empty. It's not a year and a half since David's death and I recognize that time has become my friend. Now, when I look to the future, I see hills and valleys – struggles, to be sure, but also moments spent at the summit. What has happened? Time is healing.

I still do understand when people say "give it time." That implies a passive process – that time, in and of itself will heal. I don't believe that is the case. We must take time, use the time to grieve – painfully and fully – time will heal.

#### Take time...

- **To hurt.** The pain is great and the temptation to run away is great. But there is no avoiding, no escaping, hard feelings. If you cover them over, they only resurface later in a potentially more destructive way.
- To cry. It may feel like once started, you can never stop. But you have every reason to cry, and when you have cried enpugh, you will stop.
- To "fall apart." If you had a broken leg you would not expect yourself to function at full capacity right away. Your wound is much greater you have a broken heart. Confusion, inability to concentrate, lethargy, imagined glimpses of your dead child, all are a normal part of the grieving process and do not mean you are going crazy.
- To be "selfish." Mourning is an egocentric time, a time for turning inward and introspection.
- **To identify and seek out resources.** Sensitive listeners friends, clergy, Compassionate Friends, a counselor, can help. Talk to them.

Having done all that – having lingered in the valley of the shadow, it is time to begin the long climb out.

#### Take time...

- To engage again in activities that were once pleasurable. They may hold no joy the first few times. Someday they will and that will be all right.
- **To laugh**. without guilt. Savor the good moments in the day, brief though they may be. Through your child you can rediscover the beauty of a sunset.

Be patient. Wanting to live again – learning to live again – takes time. The path out the other side of the valley is steep and we all stumble often. But with time...time spent doing the hard work of grieving...you can find the path to a world made richer by your love.

### Seventeen years ago......

"Hey Joyce, where 'ya been?" my classmate casually asks. He doesn't ralize that simple question is the most difficult for me to answer. "My brother died." At twenty-five years old, Raymond overdosed on drugs. I look away.

Can you tell how I feel by the look on my face? Can I tell you with words? Would you listen? I'm nineteen years old – I get to live, how come he didn't? Look at all he is missing – do I have a right to enjoy all this – concerts, dancing, a walk in the park - life! Do I have a right to smile when he isn't here? Was there something I could have done to help him? I'm angry! I suppose I shouldn't be, after all he was so sad and so sick. How can I be mad at someone who died? The rest of my family speaks of him as if he was a saint, yet I am filled with rage. How could you destroy our family! How could you be so selfish! I hate you!

I feel ashamed to say these words, but I can't bear walking around like I am choking. The tears come out sharply, and yes, it hurts, but the clenched fist in my heart is beginning to open. I pray that I will not be bitter. I will try to go on because I love life, and I know God wants me to live.

Seventeen years later, I enter Compassionate Friends where I can tell my story without shame – uncensored. I have come to realize I was powerless over my brother's addiction. I will always feel the sadness of this loss, but I have the right to a full and joyous life even though my brother did not survive. And so, I am grateful to experience the meaning of the word – compassion.
